In December, PacSci debuted *Brainy Bodies*, an exhibition developed in-house featuring fun, hands-on activities in English and Spanish. This exhibit celebrates how everybody experiences the world differently because of our unique brains, bodies, and the connections they share.

EDUCATION PROGRAMS

Each year, we reach beyond the bounds of our campus and deliver educational programming across Washington. Your gifts allow these high-impact courses to be offered at free or reduced cost for low-income communities, removing the physical and financial barriers to STEM education. PacSci reached 154,946 curious minds and provided free programs to more than 113,000 people on and off campus.



SCIENCE ON WHEELS

2024 marked the 50th anniversary of Science on Wheels, our mobile outreach program. PacSci brought 490 hands-on workshops directly to classrooms in FY2025. That's 103,335 students, with more than 81% going to Title I schools.

DIGITAL DISCOVERY WORKSHOPS

Our Digital Discovery Workshops reached 12,710 students this year, including more than 11,000 from low-income schools. Featuring live demonstrations of STEM concepts, these virtual lessons create budding ecologists or backyard astronomers, one hour at a time.
